MANAGING SIGNIFICANT RISK IN CARRYING AND HANDLING CARGO

UNDERSTANDING WHERE THE KEY FATALITY RISKS ARE IN THE CARGO SUPPLY CHAIN IN ORDER TO MANAGE THEM some places have more and/or bigger ports

responsibility for preventing accident does not necessarily sit with place where it happened

some places have more challenging seas



CAUTION WITH DATA

some places have busier sea lanes more international data available on maritime incidents

some reports from press – lacking inside detail

some places make more information public


> English 1st language speaker collected data not surprisingly more English than other language reports in dataset



FATAL ACCIDENTS BY ACTIVITY AND CARGO




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














FATAL ACCIDENTS BY PRESENTING CAUSE




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















FALL FROM HEIGHT FATALITY RISK IMO GISIS DATA
