



Under-identification & Underreporting


Suboptimal school asthma management

Reasons for Underreporting

Complex documentation process

- Four steps to reporting
- Requires extra visits to medical provider

Inconsistent school to parent communication

• Exacerbated by limited nursing availability

Limited access and utilization of resources

• Healthcare, transportation, community support

Limited parental knowledge of the process





Purpose of AsthmalD


Increase reporting of asthma conditions to help improve school management of asthma through comprehensive trainings for parents and school clerks

Model For Improvement

- Improved school asthma management through increased reporting to schools
- 2. Increased knowledge, confidence, and likelihood of reporting
- 3. Working with community partners on trainings and resource binder







Increased Confidence in Ability to Report Asthma Post Training






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
Correctly Identified 4 Steps of Reporting Asthma Post Training





Results - AsthmaID Clerk Trainings


Increased Confidence in Ability to Assist Parents in Reporting Post Training

Lessons Learned & Next Steps

Relationship with school clerks is vital to the reporting process

- Especially with limited nursing availability
- Have parents' trust, are known by school community

Important to collaborate with partner organizations

- Have a connection with the community
- Help to identify needs and develop content of AsthmaID
 trainings and digital binder

COVID-19 highlights need for increased asthma reporting



Lessons Learned & Next Steps

Training school clerks and parents on the reporting process increases knowledge, confidence, and likelihood of reporting

• Based on post-training survey results

Measuring changes in metrics

• Percentage of students with reported asthma at CPS

AsthmalD can be adapted

- To address reporting of other chronic conditions
- To train other staff on the process of reporting chronic conditions
- To target needs of specific schools and networks
