

- This type is known as "groupthink"









World Health Organization Maternal Mortality Rates










- The Facts: In 2019 the rate of maternal mortality was at 17.2 according to the CDC and at 20.1 according to the National Vital Statistics System.
- Black Women die at a rate of 3-4 times that of white women at the rate of 42.4/100,000 in 2019.
- 60% of maternal deaths are preventable

Leap into Action

L: Learn to recognize bias

E: Expect to find bias when you look inside, we are all bias

A: Accept that there are ways to overcome bias individually

P: Practice and Prioritize the individual strategies



Four strategies to begin to look inward and self-assess


- 1. Pause as soon as you realize you that a negative thought is formulating
- 2. Self-reflect
- 3. Breathe
- 4. Recalculate and change the trajectory of that thought
