The 2024 Annual Mentorship Gathering, themed "Our Stories. Our Medicine," brought our community together at Dalhousie University in Kjipuktuk (Halifax), Nova Scotia.

It welcomed a record 164 attendees, with medical learners making up 57% of the group. Powerful moments were shared in the gathering's sharing circles, fostering mutual learning and a celebration of our collective stories and healing knowledge.

The 2023 Annual Mentorship Gathering, themed "Planetary Health: Our Land, Our Medicine," was held on Treaty 1 Territory, in Winnipeg, MB, at the University of Manitoba.

This event welcomed 134 participants, including 64 medical learners, It was a powerful opportunity to explore the connections between health, the environment, and Indigenous knowledge.
