EXECUTIVE ORDER
ICR NO. 32, Series of 2022

AN ORDER PROVIDING LOCALIZED GUIDELINES FOR THE ALERT LEVEL 1 AND GRANULAR LOCKDOWNS IN PASAY CITY FROM MARCH 1 TO MARCH 15, 2022

WHEREAS, Section 15 of Article II of the 1987 Constitution states that the State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them;

WHEREAS, Section 16 of the Local Government Code states that every local government unit shall exercise the powers expressly granted, those necessarily implied therefrom, as well as power necessary, appropriate, or incidental for its efficient and effective governance, and those which are essential to the promotion of the general welfare;

WHEREAS, Section 478(4)(iii) of the Local Government Code provides the City may, through its health officer, execute and enforce all laws, ordinances and regulations relating to public health;

WHEREAS, Section 455(b)(1)(vii) of the Local Government Code directs that the City Mayor may carry out such emergency measures as may be necessary during times of calamity;

WHEREAS, Section 6 (e) of Republic Act. 11332, or the "The Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act," empowers local governments to conduct rapid containment, quarantine and isolation, disease prevention and control measures.

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization (WHO) declared COVID-19 as a pandemic;

WHEREAS, on 27 February 2022, the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) has placed the National Capital Region under Alert Level 2 from **March 1, 2022 to March 15, 2022** subject to the Guidelines on the Nationwide Implementation of the Alert Level System for COVID-19 Response as of 27 February 2022.

NOW THEREFORE, I, IMELDA CALIXTO-RUBIANO, Mayor of Pasay City, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby promulgate the following Localized Guidelines for the Alert Level 1 and Granular Lockdowns in Pasay City from March 1, 2022 to March 15, 2022

Section 1. Movement. Intrazonal and interzonal movement of all individuals shall be allowed without regard to age and comorbidities. All private offices and workplaces, including public and private construction sites, may operate at full 100% capacity (consistent with national issuances on vaccination requirements for on-site work). However, they may continue to provide flexible and alternative work arrangements as deemed appropriate based on function or individual risk.

The curfew for all minors (17 years old and below) in Pasay City is from Ten O'clock in the evening to Four O'clock in the morning (10:00PM to 4:00 AM).

Section 2. Vaccination Requirement. Individuals 18 years old and above are required to present proof of full vaccination before participating in mass gatherings or entry into indoor establishments including but not limited to the following:

1. In-person religious gatherings; gatherings for necrological services, wakes, inurnment, and funerals for those who died of causes other than COVID-19 and for the cremains of the COVID-19 deceased;
2. All indoor dine-in services of food preparation establishments such as kiosks, commissaries, restaurants, and eateries. For outdoor or *al fresco* dining and take out channels, **no proof of full vaccination is required**;
3. All indoor personal care establishments such as barbershops, hair spas, hair salons, and nail spas, and those offering aesthetic/cosmetic services or procedures, make-up services, salons, spas, reflexology, and other similar procedures including home service options;
4. Fitness studios, gyms, and venues for exercise and sports;
5. All indoor cinemas or movie houses operating at full capacity;
6. Meetings, incentives, conferences, exhibition events, and permitted venues for social events such as parties, wedding receptions, engagement parties, wedding anniversaries, debut and birthday parties, family reunions, and bridal or baby showers ;
7. Venues with live voice or wind-instrument performers and audiences such as in karaoke bars, clubs, concert halls, and theaters;
8. Indoor ancillary establishments in hotels and other accommodation establishments; and
9. Venues for election-related events.

Proof of full vaccination shall be required before entry in the list of identified establishments under the principles of 3C's (Closed, Crowded, and Close Contact) strategy against COVID-19. Children ages seventeen (17) and below shall not be required to present proof of full vaccination status.

Section 3. Business Establishments. All establishments, persons, or activities, are allowed to operate, work, or be undertaken at full on-site or venue/seating capacity provided it is consistent with minimum public health standards. All establishments must comply with: (i) mandatory wearing of face mask; (ii) temperature check; (iii) physical distancing of at least one meter among all persons in the establishment and work stations, unless a greater distance is specified; (iv) reduce contact and avoid mass gathering in the workplace; and (v) regular disinfection of high-touch objects like doorknobs, buttons, keypads, handles, tables, chairs and counters and high-traffic locations and common areas.

All establishments shall designate a Safety and Health Officer/s who shall ensure, monitor, and evaluate proper implementation and strict observance of the minimum public health standards. They shall prepare a contingency plan for the establishment which shall

include coordination with the local government and health care provider networks, management of staff and visitors with COVID-19 symptoms, processes for establishment lockdown and disinfection, and alternative processes in case of escalation of Alert Level status. They shall regularly disinfect high-risk areas such as but not limited to areas for gatherings, highly touched surfaces, and frequently visited areas such as entrance and exit points, restrooms, hallways, elevators using Food and Drug Administration (FDA)- approved disinfectants. All establishments shall ensure adequate air exchange and ventilation, consistent with Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) Department Order No. 224-21 *Guidelines on Ventilation for Workplaces and Public Transport to Prevent and Control the Spread of COVID-19*.

The Safety Seal Certification Program of the national government to mark their compliance with minimum public health standards is optional but all establishments are encouraged to use it as a marketing tool. The use of plastic/acrylic barriers/dividers are **optional**, as appropriate. The use of foot baths, disinfection tents, misting chambers, or sanitation booths for preventing and controlling COVID-19 transmission are **not recommended**. Temperature checking prior to the entry in any establishment may be dispensed with. All establishments are required to install/maintain hand hygiene and sanitation facilities with the following: (i) Adequate and safe water supply; (ii) Hand washing station or sink; (iii) Soap and water or 70% Isopropyl (or Ethyl) Alcohol and (iv) Hands-free trash receptacles.

Section 4. Mandatory Wearing of Face Mask. The wearing of face mask in all public places in Pasay City shall be mandatory. Face mask may be medical grade, do-it-yourself, cloth, or makeshift such as handkerchiefs, towels, bandanas, etc. as long as they snugly cover both the nose and mouth. Public places may include but not limited to public transport vehicles, markets, commercial centers, shopping malls, government offices, restaurants and eateries, among others. Individuals are also encouraged to wear face mask inside their respective place of abode. Well-fitted face masks shall be worn properly at all times, whether outdoors or in indoor private or public establishments, including in public transportation, but with the following exceptions: (a) When eating and drinking; (b) Participating in team and individual sports in venues where ventilation standards can be maintained; and (c) Practicing outdoor sports/exercise activities where physical distance can be maintained.

Section 5. Sale of Liquor. Duly licensed liquor dealers may continue to sell to their retail customers from 8am to 8pm pursuant to Ordinance No. 6162 S-2021. However, only residents of the City of Pasay are allowed to purchase during the window hours and are required to show proof of residency. Drinking in public or on sidewalks shall remain prohibited; persons may drink at home. Drinking with friends and relatives from other households is discouraged to reduce the possibility of transmission.

Section 6. Granular Lockdowns and Barangay Checkpoints. The City shall continue enforcing Granular Lockdowns over buildings, streets, blocks, puroks, villages, and other neighborhood-level areas. The City may implement granular lockdowns not only when vital to contain COVID-19 breakouts but also when preemptively necessary in areas with high risk of disease transmissions due to widespread health protocol violations or other relevant factors. The City Government, in coordination of the barangay concerned, shall determine the precise area covered by the each granular lockdown on a case-to-case basis. Within the areas under granular lockdowns, all establishment must close, and no gatherings of any kind shall be allowed, except under highly exceptional circumstances, as may be specifically authorized by the City Government. Workers in permitted establishments may leave the area within twenty four (24) hours from the imposition of the lockdown, provided they are not confirmed, probable or suspect COVID-19 cases, or close contacts of the same. However, they cannot return to the

area and must find accommodation elsewhere for the duration of the lockdown. After expiration of the lockdown, workers that left the area must obtain a negative COVID-19 test result before they may return home. Likewise, the Barangay may continue to implement road closures and control points as warranted, limited to Barangay roads, esquinitas, alleys, callejon, and other interior roads, provided that the Barangay notifies and coordinates with the City Government. In no instances shall national roads and major alternate routes be closed or controlled by the Barangay.

Section 7. Enforcement. The Philippine National Police-Pasay City, Barangay Officials and Barangay Tanods, Pasay City Public Order and Safety Unit (POSU) and Pasay City Environment and Natural Resources Office (CENRO) shall heighten the enforcement of all health measures and protocols contained in this issuance, existing Sanggunian Ordinances, and IATF Guidelines on Alert Level 1 and Granular Lockdowns.

Section 8. Violation. Persons that violate this Order may be arrested and charged under (i) existing Sanggunian Ordinances; (ii) Sec. 9 of Republic Act. No. 11332, which penalizes non-cooperation of person or entities affected by a health event of public concern; and/or (iii) Article 151 of the Revised Penal Code (Resistance and Disobedience to a Person in Authority).

Section 9. Repealing Clause. All prior orders, memoranda or similarly-situated directives inconsistent with any provision found herein shall be deemed revoked, rescinded, amended or superseded accordingly.

Section 10. Separability Clause. Any provision judicially found illegal or infirm shall not affect untouched provisions.

Section 11. Effectivity Clause. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately upon signing, and it shall remain in full force and effect until revoked, rescinded, amended or superseded accordingly.
