	Kalumburu Aboriginal Corporation (KAC) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Preparing for Kalumburu Annual Foundation Day on 15 August, celebrating the community founding in 1908 • Grant applications and opportunities <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Applied for a grant to complete maintenance work at the airstrip, to ensure use through the wet season ○ Talking to Shire of Wyndham East Kimberley (SWEK) and applying for funding for evacuation centre, to support community through cyclones and storms. The centre would be designed to house 400 people, plus the store, takeaway, warehouse, fuel bowser and possibility of caravan park. ○ Applied for funding to upgrade infrastructure at the basketball courts to include toilets and drink taps ○ Internet provider, Activ8me, to put in phone booths around the community next month, these include free wifi ○ Successful grant from Horizon power for solar lights to be installed around the community ○ Successful grant obtained for a new bus with wheelchair access but require assistance with sourcing bus. East Kimberley Job Pathways (EKJP) advised recently sourced bus with mobility aids and can provide KAC with details • Current challenges <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Staffing <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Transient community creates fluctuations in employment ▪ Due to low staff numbers, existing staff are required to work across or backfill various programs, which often includes working overtime <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Remote School Attendance Strategy (RSAS) and Youth program share five staff • RSAS supporting HAAC with transporting Elders and delivering meals while Home & Community Care (HACC) worker on leave 	EKJP and KAC to discuss sourcing bus mobility aids offline	Madeline - KAC & Laura - EKJP

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Staff were also required to assist extinguishing recent fire near community • Women’s centre no longer providing meal for Elders, this responsibility will now fall to KAC • KAC will require commercial kitchen to be certified before reuse • KAC will also require staff to undergo food handling training • RSAS program <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Staffing challenge ○ Challenges engaging children - currently 120 kids enrolled, lucky to get 30 attend ○ Concerns that a lack of support from parents is setting kids up to fail, KAC is hoping for support from families – especially around reducing gambling of both parents and children. ○ Program currently supporting many young children under 10 ○ A current program win is that when children are attending programs, they are helping out with setting up and cleaning which is a positive.
