Reference is drawn to proposed amendment to Allied Health Professions Regulations relating to the fee schedule under the Allied Health Professions Act, NO. 2818 of 02 December 2022.

The author, representing the interests of the members of the Chiropractic Association of South Africa [CASA], wishes to comment on and make representation with regard to the proposed amendments to the Regulations.

In reference to "<u>Allied Health Professions Act, 1982 (Act No. 63 of 1982), Allied</u> <u>Health Professions Regulations: Amendment 2022 and the substitution of CHAPTER</u> <u>2, CHAPTER 5, and insertion of Annexure F</u>",

- Annexure F 24(6)(a) and 40 restoration fee in the case of non-payment of fees by the practitioner and student ; 24(5) (a) and 40 – restoration fee in the case of disciplinary action by the council against the practitioner and student;
- 2. The CASA is of the opinion and holds the position that the amendments proposed in Annexure F, with the exclusion of the afore mentioned fees are acceptable
- 3. The CASA is of the opinion and holds the position that the proposed fees as listed in (1) are unacceptable and reject the proposed amendments

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4. We request that the AHPCSA review and regard the objection and provide a suitable alteration to the unacceptable fees for 24(5)(a) and 40, plus 24(6)(a) and 40.
