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HAVA Election Security Funds



- Idaho was allocated \$1
 million in the Consolidated
 Appropriations Act of 2023.
- As of March 2023, Idaho has received about \$8.9 million since FY18 and has spent 57% of those funds.







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EAC Testing and Certification

The EAC's Work To Secure Elections



The EAC is tasked with testing and certifying election equipment.



The EAC accredits independent test laboratories and facilities where equipment can be analyzed and stress tested, ensuring that the hardware and software are up to spec and performing securely and as intended.



Once a software and system completes and passes the testing process, they receive an EAC certification.

 - Procedures for manufacturers on operations and administrative requirements for the testing and certification of voting systems
- Voting System Test Lab Manual
 - Provides the procedural requirements of the EAC's accredited labs




Manufacturer Registration


- Manufacturers are required to register with the EAC
- Manufacturers must apply and provide information
- Currently 10
 - 6 that actively submit




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

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VVSG 2.0

In 2021, the EAC updated voluntary standards for voting systems to lay the groundwork for 21st century voting systems that will significantly improve cybersecurity, accessibility, and usability requirements.

The EAC is a resource for election officials to help guide them through the VVSG 2.0 migration process - from procurement to implementation.

To help state and local jurisdictions in the transition to VVSG 2.0, the EAC is consistently releasing resources to assist election officials in communicating about the migration of these standards and reassuring the public that our voting systems remain secure and accurate.




VVSG 2.0 Framework

- Principles and Guidelines
 - 15 Principles, 53 Guidelines
- Requirements
 - Nearly 1000 requirements
- Test Assertions





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What Does Certification Mean?

- A systems is compliant with VVSG requirements
 - Recommendation from test lab
 - EAC is the certification body
- Denial of Certification
 - Rarely occurs due to iterative testing process
- Decertification
 - Used only when necessary





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Field Services Program

- · Fielded systems configuration
- · Manufacturer site audit
- · Anomaly reporting
- Product advisory
- *Pre-election* training: regular hash verification
- Portal officials to assistance with other agency departments and partner agencies (grant assistance, cyber security assistance, administrative best practices training)
