




OPPRESSION

right to exploit + forced assimilation to/for the dominant culture/peoples


(Based on Geography, Gender/ Sex, Race, and even Religion)

As well as, the Legal & Political Structures to perpetuate dominance.




Colonialism is also conducted within <u>Settled States</u>.


As example: the United States, Canada & Australia.

THE UNDOING OF COLONIALISM


« the process of <u>freeing</u> an institution, sphere of activity, society, etc. from the **legal systems** & cultural/social effects of <u>Colonization</u>. »

Practice of using globalization, capitalism & cultural imperialism to influence a developing country in lieu of direct military control (imperialism) or indirect political control (hegemony)










