Rice touch half the p

Rice touches the lives of over half the people on our planet.

Since the Paris Agreement and the Methane Pledge, its linkages to multiple targets under the UN Sustainable Development Goals have been increasingly recognized in global debates and reflected programmatically in the portfolios of development agencies.

Launched in 2017, the inaugural Global Sustainable Rice Conference and Exhibition (SRP Conference) was held at the UN Conference Centre (UNCC) in Bangkok, attracting over 350 high-level delegates from 30 countries.

Well-received by members and external stakeholders alike, the event served as a forum to build the case for adoption of sustainable, climate-smart best practices, showcase achievements of SRP members and partners and foster new partnerships and networks across the stakeholder spectrum.

Conference theme

"Sustainable Rice: Food, Climate and People"

The 3rd Global Sustainable Rice Conference & Exhibition 2024 will focus on the integral role of rice at the intersection of global debates on sustainable food systems and climate change, and on challenges and emerging opportunities to contribute towards systemic rice sector transformation. The event will dovetail with the 2024 SRP Annual General Assembly meeting (for SRP members only).

The event offers SRP members and partners an opportunity to present and discuss their own initiatives to derisk their own value chains and catalyze broader change through collaboration on scaling initiatives such as the Sustainable Rice Landscapes Initiative and Global Environment Facility. It will provide a unique opportunity for diverse stakeholders to share and discuss the latest innovations and approaches, facilitate collaboration, create new partnerships and foster knowledge exchange. Digital tools will feature strongly in the program, particularly in the context of impact monitoring and carbon accounting.

SRP members and other key stakeholders will share their insights and recommendations gleaned from their active participation within the SRP framework.

This event will also highlight the new SRP Low-Carbon Assurance Modul, a key part of the SRP Assurance Scheme developed with technology and commercial partners. The initiative has received a grant from the ISEAL Innovations Fund, supported by the Swiss State Secretariat for Economic Affairs SECO.
