

Community Guidelines

Cooperation Canada is committed to ensure an engaging and welcoming environment for all participants in the event. As an organization, we are committed to justice, diversity, equity, inclusion, and anti-racism, and a world that is fair, safe and sustainable for all.

Cooperation Canada is a signatory to the <u>Anti-Racist Cooperation Framework</u> for Canada's International Cooperation Sector and the <u>Leaders' Pledge on Preventing and Addressing Sexual Misconduct</u> and abides by and promotes ethical principles through the <u>Cooperation Canada Code of Ethics</u>. As such, we have developed a set of Community Guidelines that outline our commitment to a community space characterized by respect, inclusion, equity, humility, safety and solidarity. All participants and speakers are expected to agree to the guidelines as part of their registration and engagement in an event hosted by Cooperation Canada.

- **1.** <u>RESPECT</u> This space is respectful, candid, transparent, and fair to all participants regardless of language, race, national or ethnic origin, immigration status, age, faith, career advancement, sex, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, marital status, or ability.
- **2.** <u>INCLUSION</u> This space is intended for all to contribute and participate, to give prominence to the voices and stories of those who might otherwise be excluded or not celebrated, and to seek out the wisdom and reflection of those who may not feel included in the conversation.
- **3.** <u>EQUITY</u> This space embodies a commitment to a social, cultural, economic and political process that leads to the fulfillment of fundamental human rights, peace and environmental justice. Power imbalances are inherent to international cooperation and in our work: it is our responsibility, individually and collectively, to challenge these power structures and dynamics.
- **4.** <u>HUMILITY</u> This space is created for all participants to learn, connect and share. Participants are encouraged to join the event with a spirit of openness and a recognition that the broad diversity of participants includes experience and knowledge that presents opportunities for learning and growth. Participants will be exposed to knowledge, information and ways of working that may challenge them or give rise to discomfort in the spirit of learning and unlearning.

Community Guidelines

- **5. SAFETY** This space is committed to protecting the safety, dignity, human rights and fundamental freedoms of all participants. The physical, emotional, mental, sexual, and spiritual safety of all is a priority. Participants are encouraged to take care of themselves and respect the safety of others. If you are feeling unwell, it is ok to stay at home. As a community, we do not tolerate hate, racism, sexism, homophobia, transphobia, harassment, ableism, gender-based violence, bullying and other forms of oppression. Safety is a collective responsibility and organizers are present and available to support participants.
- **6. <u>SOLIDARITY</u>** This space reflects a deep commitment to our common responsibility and solidarity for a fairer, safer and more sustainable world. As a community, our solidarity manifests in our community guidelines and the creation of a space characterized by respect, inclusion, equity, humility and safety and our support for one another in all the complex and simple ways that solidarity is shown and heard

As a participant, you are expected to have read this document and understand the commitments embodied in the community guidelines above, and therefore, commit to respect, inclusion, equity, humility, safety and solidarity.

Cooperation Canada strives to operate in line with the accountability commitments it promotes. Registration and access

Participants must be registered to attend the conference. Registered participants attending are asked to check in at the registration desk to receive their lanyards on the first day of their arrival. Registration table hours are specified in the forum schedule below. The registration table will be located on the first floor in the Foyer outside of the Canada Room. All forum attendees must wear their lanyards at all times, to ensure the safety of all participants.

Accessibility

Access for people with limited mobility is available throughout the venue. There are two main entrances to the NAC and both are accessible.

- 1. The first entrance is on Elgin Street, located at the corner of Queen and Elgin facing the National War Memorial.
- 2. The second entrance is facing the Rideau Canal. It is accessed from Lawrence Freiman Lane that starts at the corner of Queen and Elgin.

Public washrooms are available at every level of the National Arts Centre. All public washrooms include accessible and bariatric stalls, and baby change tables.

Two universal washrooms also can be found at the Canal level, to the right of the Southam Hall through the pillars. One of these universal washrooms has an automated adult lift table (with a maximum weight capacity of 500 pounds). Menstrual products are provided at the restrooms.

Prayer and meditation room

This space is intended to offer a serene escape amidst the busyness of the event. Located through the Salon on the left, it includes mats for relaxation, pillows, and comfortable seating. Feel free to use this room for quiet meditation, prayer, or simply to unwind.

Please be aware that designated prayer times are from 1-2 PM and 4-5 PM. We kindly ask for your consideration during these periods to help us maintain a peaceful atmosphere. Thank you!



Headsets can be picked up from registration desk just outside the Canada Room.


Parallel Sessions

Interpretation will be provided through **Wordly** in parallel sessions.

Each breakout room will have a sign on an easel with the Wordly QR code and directions to access the simultaneous interpretation (see example below).

- Attendees do not need to download anything, create an account, or share any personal information to access Wordly.
- You can use your personal devices, including smartphones, tablets, or computers - and headsets - to access Wordly.
- You can join a session with the Wordly Attend Web App via QR code or URL.
- You can use any modern web browser, including Chrome, Firefox, Safari and Edge.



- Terrasse Level: Rossy Pavilion


Please note that on Day 3 (October 10th), the Canada Room will be divided into two sections: the Arctic on one side and Atlantic/Pacific on the other.
