


The 2020 U.S. population was more racially and ethnically diverse than measured in 2010.

The White population remained the largest race or ethnicity group; however, the White-alone population decreased by 8.6% since 2010 to 204.3 million.



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


U.S. Two or More Races Population: 2010 vs. 2020


The Two or More Races population (also referred to as the Multiracial population) saw a 276% increase from 2010.

The percentage of people in Arkansas who identify as White-Alone or Black-Alone both dropped from 2010.






Arkansas Hispanic Population: 2010 vs. 2020


The percentage of people in Arkansas who identify as Hispanic or Latino grew by more than two percentage points from 2010.








