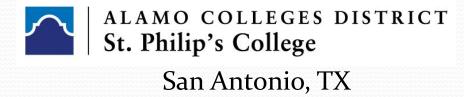

New SPC Certification Programs Initiated Fall 1998

Fall 1998 brought great changes to the IIC and the St. Philip's campus. Three new programs have been initiated to pull together in a cohesive format the variety of ad hoc workshops that the IIC has been providing since its inception a year and a half ago. Now that the IIC has a permanent home and has a few staff and faculty assigned to help support it, the dreams and aspirations of the center are being realized. The new programs initiated this fall include the IIC Certified Master Teacher, Internet Course Instructor, and the Department Webmaster.

The certification programs have been a resounding success, exceeding all expectations in terms of faculty participation, demand, and assessment. Seventy-five individual faculty and staff members are participating in one or more of the IIC certification programs. Though 21 workshops were planned for the fall, nine additional were added by faculty request.

The HC Certified Master Teacher

program is designed to address professional development needs of both new and experienced teachers as they look for creative and effective ways to develop and deliver instruction. The fourteen hour series is divided into seven workshops over the course of one academic year. Content areas include Planning Your Course, Learning-Centered Instruction, Tools for Student Assessement, Course Development, and Portfolio Development. The strength of the program lies in the opportunity for faculty members to dialog with one another about teaching, the role of the teacher, and the role of the student. 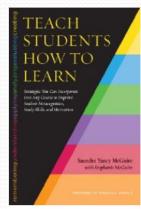

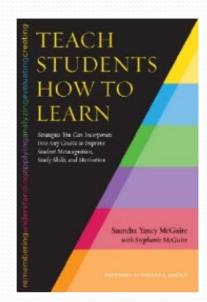




Strategies to Improve Student Learning

Assessment Strategies

- Overview
 - Determine assessments methods that are appropriate for and compatible with instructional decisions, course objectives, and student learning outcomes.
 - Develop clear grading rubrics to assess student learning





Teaching with Technology



- Overview
 - Explore a variety of teaching technologies available.
 - Review instructional benefits and challenges of specific technology and how that technology may be incorporated into your instruction.
 - Develop an instructional activity that incorporates technology.





Group Project

- Assigned groups develop a presentation based on the Strategies to Improve Student Learning module and Dr. McGuire's book, <u>Teach Students How to</u> <u>Learn</u>
- Facilitators work with assigned group
- Presentations made to the whole group during face-toface sessions
- Presentations are recorded



Applying Best Practices – Individual Project

- Participants develop a lesson or other class activity for one of their classes based on the topics covered in the program.
- Lesson is video recorded.
- Results of video recordings reviewed and discussed during Face-to-Face Sessions.



Requirements

- Orientation session
- Online course with 5 topic modules (Canvas LMS)
 - Readings, Discussions, Assignments
- Group project
- Individual assignment (video recorded)
- Face-to-face discussion sessions
- Teaching Philosophy Statement
- Reflections report
- Time to complete program 22 hours





Renewal Process

- Certification Renewal Process
 - Certification must be renewed **every 2 years**.
 - To renew, faculty must provide documentation of **one** of the following.
 - Attend and engage in twelve (12) hours of Professional Development in Teaching and Learning;
 - Earn six (6) graduate hours in education or your teaching discipline; or
 - Present at two state or national conferences
 - Renewal documentation submitted through a Canvas course

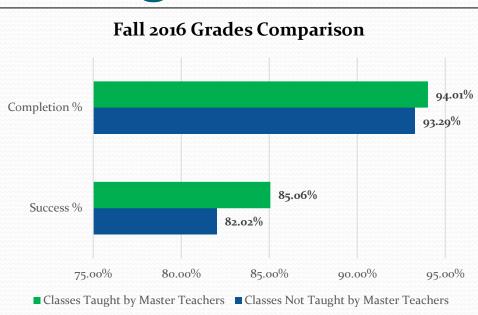


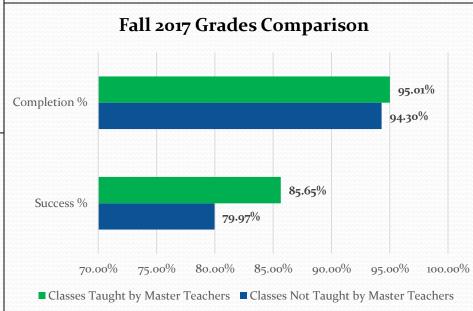
Program Effectiveness

- Challenges
 - Arranging face-to-face meetings
 - Teaching schedules can make discussion groups and communication among collaborators difficult.
 - Managing participant progress during the program
 - Managing renewal process each year
- Where do we go from here?
 - Updating the online course content
 - Expanding the program to target dual credit teachers
 - Create a faculty learning circle through collective readings and discussions of scholarly literature and books of interest to address shared concerns and enhance teaching
