Before joining Microsoft, Marcus worked for the World Bank on digital economy and trade issues, in Singapore and Geneva. He began his career as an Australian diplomat, with assignments in Geneva at the World Trade Organization, and in Bangkok working on regional economic

cooperation programs.

In addition to a practice specialty in the field of information and privacy law, he held warrants as a district inspector for mental health, and as district inspector for intellectual disability services and has provided legal services to the Kingdom of Tonga.

In October 2014 John was elected Chair of the Executive Committee of the International Conference of Data Protection and Privacy Commissioners and completed his 3 year term in October 2017.

Dr Clarisse Girot is a Senior Fellow at the Asian Business Law Institute (ABLI), a legal think tank based in Singapore which initiates and conducts projects that promote the convergence of business laws in Asia. ABLI's Board of Governors is chaired by Chief Justice Menon of the Supreme Court of Singapore and comprises fourteen influential members drawn from the judiciary, academia and practitioners from APAC jurisdictions including Singapore, China, India and

Australia, and from Europe and America.

Since January 2017, Clarisse has been leading ABLI's Data Privacy Project on the convergence of laws and regulations on cross-border data flows in Asia. The project is run in coordination with a unique network of experts in governments, data protection commissions, industry, legal practice, regional and international organisations. Prior to relocating to Singapore in 2016, she was based in Paris where she acted as Counsellor to the President of the French Data Protection Authority.

Clarisse graduated from the Law Faculty of the University of Paris II Panthéon Assas in 1994. She holds a Magister Juris (M.Jur) of the Law Faculty of the University of Oxford (Univ, 1995) and a Ph.D. in comparative law from the Tilburg Institute for Law and Technology (TILT) of the University of Tilburg in the Netherlands (*Cum Laude*, 2001).

During her four years at Gartner, Inc., Evelyn was involved in Gartner's telecommunications research and advisory in Southeast Asia and China. Evelyn graduated with a Bachelor of Science (Computer Science and Information Systems) with Honours from the National University of Singapore.
