Terms of Reference

Business and Human Rights Forum 2019

Indonesia Global Compact Network (IGCN), Oxfam GB in Indonesia (Oxfam), International NGOs Forum on Indonesian Development (INFID) are in collaboration to run European Union (EU) funded program titled “Walking the Talk: Promoting Accountable Business through Advancement of United Nations Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights (UNGPs) Implementation in Indonesia.” Throughout 3 years, the project has facilitated numerous dialogues with various intriguing topics and has gathered more than 1000 leaders to discuss their experience and challenges in implementing business and human rights in their respective areas.

This year, IGCN, INFID and OXFAM are in collaboration with Ministry of Social Affairs and Ministry of Law and Human Rights to conduct a strategic forum titled “Business and Human Rights Forum 2019” on 27 February 2019 at Le Meridien Hotel and will attract more than 100 stakeholders from companies, CSOs, government and academia. This forum will include Multi-stakeholders Dialogues to facilitate information-sharing and learnings for stakeholders about the implementation of UNGPs in Indonesia, and the launch of the first Business and Human Rights online platform in Indonesia to provide accessible information for learning about business and human rights practices.

The forum aims to promote, facilitate and implement UNGPs, to raise awareness on the implementation of Business and Human Rights, to support corporation, civil society and academia through collaborative actions in achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), to strengthen National Action Plan on Human Rights (NAP HR) and to pursue National Action Plan on Business and Human Rights (NAP BHR) in Indonesia.

Objective

1. To provide and facilitate a platform for information sharing and learning on the implementation of UNGPs

2. To further reflect on UNGPs trends and implementations for the past 7 years, address progress and challenges, and examine new opportunities to move forward
3. To update progress from Government, CSOs, Academia, and Corporation towards National Action Plan in ASEAN countries
4. To raise awareness on the implementation of BHR in Indonesia to promote accountable business

Output

A consolidated report on the progress, accomplishment and best practices from past collaborative actions as recommendations to further support actions in pursuing NAP BHR.

Participants

Participants of this workshop will consist of 100 participants from Government, Business, CSOs and academia.

Context

Government of Indonesia, through Presidential Decree no. 75 year 2015 (*Perpres Nomor 75 Tahun 2015*) for NAP 2015 - 2019 whereupon revised in Presidential Decree no. 33 year 2018 (*Perpres Nomor 33 Tahun 2018*), has affirmed the state responsibility to support the implementation of stronger human rights institution to establish, monitor, evaluate and report the implementation of NAP.¹ With the existing NAP 2014 – 2019 comes to an end, it is important to discuss on the significance of strengthening the role Business and Human Rights (BHR) in the next NAP 2020–2024.

Business, as it is described by UN Human Rights, plays roles and responsibility to protect human rights, alongside their growing impact. The UN Guiding Principles; to protect, respect, and give access to remedy, which is fully endorsed by the UN in 2011, has become the basis of framework for corporate and business enterprises to prevent and address human rights linked to business activity.
