

TERMS OF REFERENCE

World Water Day 2019 Celebration
Panel Discussion and Public Lecture
22 April 2019

1. Background

Today, billions of people are still living without safe water – their households, schools, workplaces, farms and factories struggling to survive and thrive. Marginalized groups – women, children, refugees, indigenous peoples, disabled people and many others – are often overlooked, and sometimes face discrimination, as they try to access and manage the safe water they need.

People are left behind without safe water for many different reasons. The following are some of the ‘grounds for discrimination’ that cause certain people to be particularly disadvantaged when it comes to accessing water: sex, gender, race, ethnicity, religion, birth, caste, language, and nationality, etc. Other factors, such as environmental degradation, disasters, climate change, population growth, conflict, forced displacement and migration flows can also disproportionately affect marginalized groups through impacts on water.

The global theme for World Water Day 2019 is ‘Leaving no one behind’. This is an adaptation of the central promise of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development: as sustainable development progresses, everyone must benefit. In addition, Sustainable Development Goal 6 (SDG 6) includes a target to ensure availability and sustainable management of water for all by 2030. By definition, this means leaving no one behind.

Taking the global theme, UNESCO Office Jakarta, Indonesia Global Compact Network (IGCN), and Faculty of Mathematics and Natural Science, the University of Indonesia will jointly organize seminar to celebrate World Water Day 2019. The event will bring together experts, relevant national stakeholders, universities, and development partners, to exchange their views on the “water for all”.

In addition, the event will launch the World Water Development Report (WWDR) 2019: Leaving No One Behind, which is an annual and thematic report, developed through the joint effort of the UN agencies and entities that focuses on different strategic water issues. The report aims to provide decision-makers with the tools to implement sustainable use of water-related programme. Finally, the event will feature the launch of a water campaign called “Biopore program for public facilities”, an initiative developed and implemented by IGCN and its networks.

2. Objectives

The objectives of the event are to:

- a) Discuss and exchange views on tackling the water crisis by addressing the reasons why so many people are being left behind.
- b) Highlight the importance of water for all solution for public mobilization towards the sustainable implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) – 6
- c) Launch the World Water Development Report (WWDR) 2019 to the Government of Indonesia.
- d) Showcase the achievement and further charter got UNESCO Jakarta and IGCNs partnerships in the SDG 6 related fields across Indonesia.

3. Time and agenda

The event will take place on 22 April 2019 at the University of Indonesia, consisting of the panel discussion, and the launch of World Water Development Report (WWDR) 2019. The event will also present a public lecture during afternoon session. The tentative agenda of the event is presented in Annex 1 of this ToR.

4. Participant

It is anticipated around 120 participants will part take in this event. The event will bring together the speakers from the United Nations (UN) agencies, universities, ministries, and private sectors. Other relevant government departments – working on water sector – will be invited.
