

Term of Reference Healthcare Mission | August 10 – 11, 2022

Background

Looking at the continuous improvements in Indonesia's Covid-19 situation, the pandemic is already effectively being treated as chronic and endemic. As we reflect on our experiences during the height of the pandemic, however, it is clear that Covid-19 put enormous strain on Indonesia's health care system and preparedness. With the government promising concrete healthcare deliverables in the upcoming G20 summit and the Ministry of Health's ambitious primary care reform, the country is pushing for vast improvements in the sector. However, this cannot be done alone.

Recognizing the importance of multi-stakeholder collaboration, the American Chamber of Commerce in Indonesia and the US Chamber of Commerce will be hosting a hybrid **2022 Healthcare Mission August 10-11 in Jakarta**. This will serve as a platform to bring together prominent healthcare providers, industry players and the government to discuss ways in which we can overcome challenges, find solutions and gain insight on investment opportunities in health.

Objectives

This year's Healthcare Mission is focused on engagements with prominent healthcare stakeholders, providing a platform for participants to engage and discuss how the private sector can help the government reaching their healthcare priorities, as well as discuss potential challenges and solutions.

Identified Priority Areas for Mission

The Healthcare Mission will focus on topics and issues, such as:

- Building a patient-centric ecosystem by prioritizing patient access to innovative products and treatments
 - Creating a sound research and development (R&D) ecosystem by protecting intellectual property (IP) rights
 - Facilitating voluntary technology transfer and accelerating licensing for innovative products/treatments
 - The use of local content regulations on pharmaceuticals and medical devices (TKDN)
 - o The procurement system for the e-catalog
 - Halal policies
 - Promoting public health through proper food labeling
- Digital transformation of health
 - Digitizing public procurement
 - Developing integrated and secured healthcare data while upholding patient data privacy
 - o Potential collaboration with the private sector



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- Utilization of telehealth capabilities to reach remote populations
- Healthcare financing
 - o Updates on Indonesia's universal healthcare insurance
 - Creating innovative financing alternatives to expand coverage, premium collection and strategic purchasing
 - Expansion of Cooperation of Benefits (CoB) for broader JKN coverage
 - o Increasing both public and private investment across the full healthcare value chain
- Foreign investment in the healthcare sector
 - o International hospital investment in Indonesia opportunities and challenges
 - Technology transfer and/or localization opportunities and challenges
 - Special Economic Zones (SEZ) in the healthcare sector
 - o Is Indonesia ready to open up its health care sector?
- Health systems strengthening (HSS) and resiliency
 - Public-private collaboration to strengthen basic health infrastructure, financing, workforce, service delivery, and access to health products
 - Ensure current HSS efforts protect not only against infectious diseases but also noncommunicable diseases (NCDs)
- Indonesia's leadership on G20 priorities in the health sector
 - Health and Finance Ministers Taskforce
 - Sustainable healthcare financing
 - Antimicrobial Resistance, including for MDR-TB
 - Value-based healthcare to shift reimbursement and incentives to support patient outcomes.
